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FROM PRINCIPAL SCHEIDEL

Fort Vancouver High School Families and Community,

As we conclude the first semester and start the second, I want to thank you all for your continued support of the school improvement efforts at FVHS. So many great things are happening at our school and the positive cultural movement is strong and deepening. It takes awhile to start seeing the fruits of the efforts. For the five years I have been the principal at our school, we have been diligent and relentless in trying to build the type of community and culture that invites more students to engage in the improvement work too. We have made progress with each step and now the progress is starting to bear significant fruit.

I see this engagement and improvement every day, in the following ways: Our efforts to ensure that students are in class, have a pass when out of class, and follow up with them (including engaging families) when they are not having profound effects. The halls are clearer, more students are in class longer, and more students are taking advantage of the learning before them. Teachers continue to work tirelessly, every day, to create learning experiences that engage students at increasingly high levels. More students are engaging in our Career and Technical Education classes. Culinary, Fabrication, and our Medical Magnet are laboratories of engagement. In addition, Horticulture, Photography, Engineering, Coding, Marketing, Child Development are other cool options that students have to engage in their learning. Along with core academic-focused classes like English, Social Studies, Science, and Math, there are other elective options where students can find interest and fulfillment, such as Art, Pottery, World Languages, Music, and humanities-based choices. When students experience challenges in their learning progress, we have school-based alternative pathways that enable students to get back on track and find hope in the process.

Another key is building a stronger sense of community through embracing our work as a Center for International Studies, and highlighting student assets through regular gatherings. In addition to school wide pep assemblies, we have had monthly assemblies that have allowed us to showcase the many and varied cultures of our students. Celebrations around Spanish Heritage, Indigenous peoples, Veterans Day, and last week's viewing of "Children's March," in commemoration of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., have all been ways to highlight, embrace, and value the broad range of students who make up our wonderful student body. As they see themselves valued in the celebrations we have, the more they engage in the daily efforts needed to transform our school.

There is much more to what we have been doing and what we will continue to do in the improvement efforts. This is just a sampling. Thank you to our community as we continue step by step in the improvement journey.

IMPORTANT YEARBOOK INFO!



Because most families are interested in their students participating in the yearbook, and the deadlines are quickly approaching, effective Monday, January 29, the District will update your student account to include the following permission: *I grant permission for my student's photograph to be published in the school yearbook.*

If you do not wish for your student's photo to be included in the school yearbook, you must <u>update the permissions settings in ParentVUE</u> or contact your school for support to make changes immediately.

Even if you are comfortable with this change, it is still important for you to access ParentVue and review the other permissions that remain outstanding. Not doing so could possibly impact your child's eligibility for guaranteed admission to colleges and universities as well as other opportunities.

If you have trouble accessing ParentVUE, please contact your school.

Yearbooks should be pre-paid to ensure receiving a book. We sold out the last two years! Yearbooks are \$50.00 each, payable in the Business Office.

BILINGUAL STUDENTS!

Bilingual students can earn high school credit for their additional languages! Students who can read, write, speak, and listen in a language other than English should sign up for the AVANT test, coming in December. Please take the practice test and then sign up <u>here</u> or use the link sent to your student email.

For our multilingual families,

Each year in February, students in English learner programs take the ACCESS for ELLs language proficiency test. The test measures academic English language growth for students learning English in our school and throughout our state.

Teachers in our school use this information to help them make decisions about instruction for your child. Teachers also use these test scores to monitor the progress your child makes toward English proficiency.

Sponsored by Vancouver Public Schools Family Medicine of Southwest Washington Available to Vancouver Public School students entering 6th through 12th grades

These physicals are provided by volunteers and are meant to target those athletes with difficulty accessing care or who do not have health insurance. If you have access to primary care, please have your sports physical performed there. Students with known cardiac, asthma, diabetes and/or seizure related issues or other conditions of concern cannot be served. If an abnormality is found, you will be referred to your primary care provider before being cleared for your sport. Sports physical staff will facilitate a referral to a primary care provider.
